

The pictures are awesome. Thank you so much. The boys and parents had a blast!. The program that Mike and Mrs. D. put on was fantastic.


You'll be happy to know that some of the boys have asked their parents to look into the archery programs that Mike and Mrs. D. spoke to them about.

PROPOSED NEW JERSEY BEAR SEASON



NJ Fish & Game Council has adopt the new "Comprehensive Black Bear Management Policy" which includes a bear season during the 6-day firearm buck season. The policy doesn't become law until published in the NJ Register.



Interested hunters who have not attended a NJ Fish & Wildlife Bear Hunting Seminar, from 2003 to present, needs to attend a seminar. A complete August schedule of classes was posted on the hunter ed. registration page last Thursday. More classes will be added as needed each month throughout the fall up until the weekend before the season. The class will utilize the 45-minute video that was developed before the 2003 season, followed by a very brief Q&A session. A "frequently asked questions" handout will be available to all attendees. Unlike previous Bear Hunter trainings, there will be no bear biologists or representatives from law enforcement.



The application period for the bear season will run from October 1 through October 30. Applications can be submitted online or at a licensed agent. There will be a \$2.00 processing fee per permit. Bear hunt zones area will be broken into 4 zones north of Rt. 78 and West of Rt. 287 and 10,000 permits will be available. New this season, you will be able to pick up a second permit over the counter for a different zone. (provided there are left over permits) The season limit will still be one bear.





UGGHH! PAINFUL TRUTHS By Jorge L. Coppen

....Yes, I'd like to tell you I arrowed him but not so...I cannot lie.....I was on an Alaskan float trip on the Yuki River in Sept. 2002. After losing 3 days of a 10-day moose hunt waiting in camp - since the pilot had crashed his plane in an unauthorized refuge area. The outfitter was subsequently banned from all Refuge hunts because of the violation. Finally, a replacement plane arrived and we were tossed onto the Yuki River 30 miles outside of Galena for 7 days. I strictly bowhunted for 6 days and by mid-week I had missed on a shot at a lesser (but legal) bull moose at 40 yds. with my bow.

Tired from the week, I woke up at 8:00 AM (late!) at the "outfitters pick-up point" on the last morning and decided I'd take BOTH my bow.....and a gun (incase a moose was way out of bow range on the last day. Hey! I paid lots of money for this hunt!). I heard a shot and figured the last bull moose in this county had just been killed! Oh well, might as well enjoy a morning walk!

So, I walked through some willows and heard heavy splashing on the other end of the peninsula (the neck of a river meander). Reasoning it was a large critter, probably either a moose or grizzly crossing the water, I ran straight toward it 300 yards. When I got to the shore I looked for tracks but saw none. I set my bow down next to the shoreline and pondered my predicament. I decided to walk up to the crest of the bank 25 yds. away....then I decided to grunt and rake vegetation and see what happens. Instantly, the huge bull's left antler appeared at 20 YARDS as he crashed through the spruces and grunted his way right at me at a steady gait, rocking his antlers to and fro! He looked mad!!!

I glanced back at my bow which was 25 yds. away! No way, dude! So, I went down on one knee and shouldered the rifle. I looked through the scope when he was just 15 yards away and I looked up at him. He stopped walking at EXACTLY 10 YARDS from me and stared at me like as if to say "What the hell is that!" I looked back through the scope and saw his



muzzle. Bringing the scope down to his chest I thought "Kill him before he charges you!" I aimed for the heart and squeezed. Blood gushed out in buckets and he took 3 steps toward the river and fell over. The ground SHOOK! Then I started shaking. Gun or bow, I will never forget that experience at 10 yards! Check out the "coat hook" on his right antler in the picture! The other moose is my buddy's.

Archery Archives

The legendary... Howard Hill

Howard Hill, called "Ol' One Shot," was physically strong and big, standing 6' 2" and sporting huge forearms. Hill played football, basketball & baseball at Auburn University & played semi-pro baseball for 7 years. But, when he read The Witchery Of Archery by Maurice Thompson, his life



turned to the promotion of Archery. Continued demand for Howard Hill's works, Hunting The Hard Way and Wild Adventure show that his popularity with archers has not waned since his death in 1975. Many suggest he was the greatest archer of the century.

Howard Hill designed & made all of his own equipment. He championed heavy bows & arrows. He liked longbows drawing 75-100 #s for hunting with his preferred weight in the 80-90 # range. Hill amassed a record of game taken that may never be surpassed including an Elephant he took in 1950 while hunting in Africa. He was the first white man to kill an Elephant with a bow (which had a draw weight of 115 #).

Howard Hill earned many awards during his career including the Maurice Thompson Medal of Honor in 1963, the National Archery Association's most prestigious award. He was among the first group of archers inducted into the Archery Hall of Fame. He won 196 Field Archery tournaments in a row, wrote the first set of Archery Golf Rules in 1928, won seven National Archery Golf tournaments, won the NAA Flight Championship in 1928 setting a new record.

Howard became involved with the film making industry

as an archery consultant and performed the actual shooting scenes in eight movies. Who can forget Howard's incredible shooting in " The Adventures of Robin Hood," starring Errol Flynn.



Old School Archery Articles #4

Gleaned by Ray Tareila

Hi Gang! Here is an old story from a great old archery magazine entitled "The National Bowhunter" dated March 1960 of which I have a few copies. There were a series of articles written by Chester Stevenson under the heading of "From the Den of the Old Bowhunter" Many of these great articles were compiled and published a few years ago in a book entitled "The Old Bowhunter" If you haven't read it, it is one of the archery classics and should be on your library shelf to be read over and over again. Stevenson was a photographer from Oregon who started to bowhunt when it was first permitted on the West Coast. He was an accomplished bowyer and arrowsmith whose writing style had you hunting right beside him.

This article was called: **Beaver Tail Soup**

"We have had many bow hunts on Wolf Creek in the Coast Range Mts. only a few miles west of Eugene, Oregon. In the early days the Indians kept some of the underbrush burned off and deer hunting was wonderful. There are still lots of deer there but with the present fire protection the brush has grown so dense that hunting is very difficult. Don Chuck and I hunted this area on Wolf Creek often and usually had good luck. Don was my Indian friend the last of his line. He was an expert at hunting and really talked the language of the Black Tail deer.

When I first met Don his tackle was rather crude but served his purpose well. He made good arrows but did not like to build a bow, so mostly he used mine. I still have an old osage bow that he shot thousands of times over several years. It is still a good bow and holds an honorable place on the wall of my den.

Have gone hunting with Don when with two shots we would bring two bucks home. Other times we would camp for several days and shoot for hours with hundreds of shots at close up targets around camp. It was a treat to see Don shoot and to shoot with him. I shot and hunted with Don for thirty years

until his death five years ago.

Getting back to Wolf Creek; on one trip out there Don and I had made camp and were broiling a couple of big trout for supper when an old trapper came by and stopped to visit. He said his cabin was a mile down the creek. He had supper with us and sat at our campfire until long after dark. We heard a lot of old trapping stories.

The next morning I slept in, and when I awoke, there sat Don at the fire with a cup of coffee in one hand and a big grin on his face as he pointed to a nice buck hanging on our tree. I think he must have had a date with that deer because he got up at daylight and killed it within three hundred yards of camp. We put some targets on an old rotten log and exercised our bows for the rest of the day. Next morning we started for a hunt and came by the old trapper's cabin. He had three beaver from the morning's catch and was busy skinning them. He cut off a big flat tail and threw it aside. Don asked him for it. "Sure," he said, "Here take them all if you want them." Don picked out the biggest one and stowed it in his bag. The trapper insisted we stay for dinner with him and we watched while he started his fire and began with the flapjacks. He had a roasted deer ham, a jar of tomato preserves, flap jacks, and roast venison. How was that for a meal?

I asked Don what he would do with that beaver tail. "Soup," he said. He skinned the tail and diced it and put it on the fire to stew. A beaver tail is like a fat hen, full of yellow fat and equally tasty. Don watched it cook while he prepared some potatoes, carrots and onions, which he then added to the mixture. He seasoned it to his taste and I had to admit it smelled good. He handed me a big bowl with one for himself and it tasted good, too. Try it sometime."

Ray's comment: Those were good days of true living.




Capillo's Crab Cakes (secret recipe, shh!)

INGREDIENTS:







1 sleeve Ritz crackers finely ground

1 bowl of Panko breadcrumbs

2 tablespoons butter

3 Scallions chopped

½ bell red or green pepper diced small no seeds

1 medium onion diced (red)

1 celery ribbed stick diced

2 eggs scrambled (raw)

½ lemon juiced

½ teaspoon garlic powder

1 teaspoon Worcestershire Sauce

1 teaspoon dry mustard

1 dash smoked paprika

1dash Cayenne pepper

1 ½ teaspoon Old Bay

¹/₄ cup real mayonnaise


Canola or peanut oil for frying pan only

Large non-stick frying pan

Sauté slow scallions, bell peppers, onion & celery

2 teaspoons of butter

Now combine all other ingredients except Panko & Frying Oil. Form the crab cakes in palm of hands then place them in fridge for one hour to firm before frying cover with Saran Wrap tight! After an hour take out the crab cakes and roll in fresh Panko breadcrumbs. Make sure pan is hot and keep on medium heat -cook away (do not turn until one side is done 5-8 minutes). "Good Eat's" as they say...Serve with a good white wine or ice cold Carlsberg beer.

Dear Traditional Bowhunters,

You may be aware of the Colorado Traditional Bowhunting Camp that my son Chris and I started in 2008. The concept was simple: to help traditional bowhunters enjoy an elk hunt in Colorado by pooling our resources to rent yurts and cabins and food. By doing that, a guy can afford to go elk hunting on public land for about a thousand bucks, including a nonresident license. We're not guides or outfitters,. We just help coordinate efforts to get lodging and grub and tell them how the hunt is possible. If a hunter gets a good taste for hunting in the mountains, he can do it again on his own or hire professional guides and outfitters. My son and I are just trying to give back to this great sport for the great enjoyment we have gotten from it.

Take a Veteran Out Hunting is a very important part of these hunts. We raise funds and provide a free hunt for veterans who have served in combat in Iraq or Afghanistan. Some of these veterans have served 2 or 3 deployments. Some have been severely wounded in combat and all have been traumatized by war. We try to show our appreciation for their service and help them to have fun in this great sport. In 2008, we raised enough money to host 7 combat veterans, in 2009 we hosted 6 and this year we are taking at least 6. Last year, most of our veteran guests were stationed at Fort Carson, CO so we were able to buy them hunting licenses at resident fees and the transportation costs were low. This year, all of our veteran guests are from out of state so the cost is much greater. I still need almost \$4,000 to pay expenses for these 6 combat veterans. I'm asking traditional bowhunting clubs and individuals for whatever assistance you can give. In return, I can't give much except my sincere thanks and an 8x10 photo of the veterans that you help. I'll let them all know of your generosity, but you'll just have to know that you and your fellow bowhunters have helped good men find a way to heal the scars of war.

Our hunt is scheduled for 27 AUG – 5 SEP, so please send what you can soon. You can find a lot of info on the web by going to Stickbow.com, then clicking on Letherwall and looking for the threads for Colorado Trad Bow Camp.

If you know an Iraq/Afghanistan veteran that you would like to sponsor, I can make room at the camp. The cost breakdown is: bunk \$125, grub \$100, nonresident license \$550 (proof of hunter ed. or bowhunter ed. required) and transportation. May God bless America and those who defend us.



Venison Recipes:

Garlic Steaks

INGREDIENTS:

1 1/2 to 2 lbs. game tenderloin steak

3 Tbsp. margarine

1/2 to 1 tsp. garlic powder

1/4 tsp. seasoned salt

1/4 tsp. pepper

1/2 cup vermouth

Remove all fat from your venison steaks. In a skillet, heat margarine and stir in garlic, salt and pepper. Mix well into the margarine. Fry the steaks in the hot margarine until they are done the way you prefer. Venison tenderloin cooks fast. About 3 to 6 minutes on each side for medium rare, depending on the steak thickness.

Remove the venison steaks from the skillet to a hot plate to keep warm. Add vermouth to the drippings in skillet and stir about one minute. Then spoon over the steaks and serve Serves 4-6 people.
